

PARADE RULES 2021

Deadline for all entries is Friday, November 19, at 4 p.m. A late fee of \$25 will be charged for all entries after that date. All entry fees must be paid at the Alexander County Cooperative Extension Department located in the Alexander County Service Center at 151 West Main Avenue, Taylorsville. Fees must be paid at the time of registration. There will be **no refunds** of the entry fee. All entries are encouraged to have some kind of holiday decoration or theme for the entertainment of the crowd. However, **no entry will be allowed to have Santa or Mrs. Claus on the entry** because it is confusing for the children if there are multiple Santa's. All entries must stay in their assigned line-up positions. The parade committee will have authority to make last minute changes on parade day.

Failure to obey the parade line-up committee and stay in your assigned positions will result in dismissal from the parade with no refunds!

All horse/rider entries will be grouped together (individuals and riding clubs) and are responsible for securing and providing a clean-up crew to immediately follow in parade.

All motorcycle, go-carts, and horse-rider entries must have liability insurance of \$300,000 single limits, including property damage and bodily injury and provide a copy of their certificate of insurance to the Chamber of Commerce office upon entry registration.

Drivers of all vehicles must have appropriate licenses at time of registration.

The parade will be limited to 200 entries - first come, first serve. In 2019 we filled up quickly, so pay your fees and have this out of the way.

Please remember to leave space between YOU and the unit in front of you. This will allow the public to see your unit and move their eyes to the next unit. All units should proceed down the middle line in the road.

The parade line-up will be published in the *Taylorsville Times* on Wednesday, December 1, 2021. Please make note of your entry number, this will save YOU and our volunteer's times. Please share this number with anyone riding in the parade with you.

Candy may be tossed in the parade route. Everyone is asked to be extremely careful when tossing candy.

Candy is to be tossed VERY GENTLY AS NOT TO HARM OR HURT ANYONE. (If caught violating this rule, you will be dismissed from the parade.) Alexander County Government is not liable for any injuries or violation of this rule.

Adults are asked to supervise children viewing parade and prevent them from running out into the street. We ask that all children be kept on the sidewalk/sideline area. (This is very important!)

All parade drivers are asked to be EXTREMELY careful and alert to children and parade viewers.
