Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year **2019-2020** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2019**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

Mediation/Conflict Resolution

The JCPC will accept applications that collaborate with surrounding counties to provide multi-county programming.

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

- 1. Juveniles who associate with other delinquent youth;
- 2. School Behavior Problems
- 3. Parents/Guardians who have diffuculty providing adequate supervision;
- 4. Reduction in Juvenile Recividism

Peer Domain:	Juveniles who associate with others involved in delinquent activity.			
Individual Domain:	Mental health services are critical issues in providing assistance to youth and families involved in the juvenile justice system. Programs receiving funds shall provide appropriate access to these services.			
Family Domain:	Parental Support and/or parental enhancement skills needed for court referred youth. Access services that provide best practices and have the ability to engage families are needed.			
School Domain:	Youth involved with Juvenile Court have an increased risk of school behavior issues reflected in prolonged absences and suspensions.			

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.

2. Program services are outcome-based.

3. The program has an evaluation component.

4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
